

Instructions:

1. Laminate, if possible. Provide a dry-erase marker to trace the number 1.
2. Provide a blue crayon and a red crayon to color in the number 2.
3. Cut the 3 into three 3s. I cut mine so that each part is a 3, and they nest.
4. Cut a separate sheet of paper into 4 strips that will overlap to create a 4.
5. Provide 5 square blocks (or stickers).
6. Cut the 6 puzzle pieces out. You can give the child a separate 6 to put the puzzle pieces on, or you can just give the puzzle pieces on their own.
7. Provide 7 paper clips or clothes pins.
8. Laminate if possible. Use a hole puncher to punch out the 8 holes. Provide a string or shoelace for lacing practice.
9. Provide 9 circle beads, stickers, or anything round that will fit the page.
